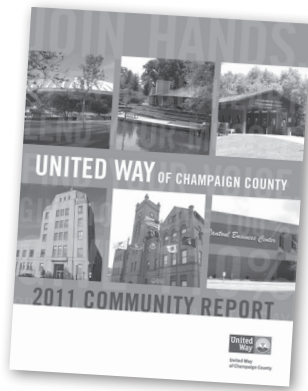

Community Impact Fund

The United Way of Champaign County addresses serious local issues like hunger, homelessness, child abuse and neglect, domestic violence and support for senior citizens. By funding local human service agencies young children can be assured of crisis care around the clock, advocacy in foster care, access to medical and dental care, school readiness programs and special services for developmental disabilities. Youth in our community receive mentoring, homework assistance, afterschool and summer programs, opportunities to participate in recreation and scouting, shelter for runaway teens and emergency services for homeless children trying to stay in school. Families get help meeting basic needs by accessing food assistance from local pantries, finding transitional housing in local shelters, escaping abuse from domestic violence and gain self sufficiency through money management classes. Individuals with disabilities receive apartment and employment assistance and adults with mental health challenges find treatment for a range of issues. Finally, senior citizens can continue to live independently in their homes through delivered meals and health care assistance.

United Way of Champaign County funds programs that provide essential services to those most vulnerable in our local community. In addition UWCC advocates for services, promotes collaboration and cooperation between service providers, state and local governments and the business community. Champaign County is a better place to live, work and raise our children because the needs of so many are met through gifts to the Community Impact Fund.

Did you know? United Way of Champaign County has released the 2011 Community Report. Last spring the board, staff and a number of volunteers began to collect important data from all areas of the county. We conducted a community survey with educators, health care professionals, law enforcement and first responders, municipal government, local media and our human service partners. Designation Guidelines

When you choose to give directly to a specific agency or another United Way, the following procedures apply:

- A minimum amount of \$100 is required for each separate agency designated. You may designate as many agencies as you wish, but each must be a 501c3 charitable organization.
- In the event a designation received is less than the \$100 minimum, the funds will be distributed through the Community Impact Fund.
- Designations to United Way member agencies will be paid separately from their United Way allocation.
- A 6% fee for administration will be deducted on those designations to a 501c3 organization.
- Funds will be forwarded to agency(s) based on compliance with the USA PATRIOT ACT.
- There are no fees for gifts made to the Community Impact Fund, Community Basics, Education, Health & Well-Being, Financial Stability and Safety Net funds.

Gifts not indicating a choice or not meeting these guidelines will be distributed through the Community Impact Fund. United Way of Champaign County does not provide fiscal or program oversight for funds designated to a specific agency, nor can it certify the financial or program viability of agencies for those programs not reviewed by our volunteer committees.
